Dear Parents,

Nowadays, many parents are busy working. They rely on helpers for taking care of the kids. A recent study has found that nearly 90 percent of parents have foreign domestic helpers to take care of their children, the children's ability to take care of themselves will be affected. I understand the feelings of parents. They are busy working but they are also worried about their children. Therefore, I am going to give some useful suggestions to all parents in Hong Kong.

At the beginning, 50 percent of the parents interviewed pointed out that their children could not eat, take a bath or change clothes by themselves. I advice parents to take their children to participate in wild camps. Although it is a challenging and tough task for children who are used to being helped, wild camps can enhance their life skills and collaborations and let them try to be independent. For example, the camp mentor would only give them a map, compass, some drinks and food and requests them to find a place. In the process, they will be more confident and stop relying on maids.

In addition, only less than 20 percent of the parents would take their children out to play with classmates or neighbours. If children, especially teenagers lack friends, it will suppress their emotions. It will always make them feel frustrated. It is a good idea for them to take part in extra-curricular activities. I think it can help broaden their social circle, for example, taking part in martial arts club. Through learning martial arts, it can help develop self-motivation, self-discipline and concentration.

More importantly, children spend too much time on the internet. Many children indulge in the internet. I think parents are responsible for explaining to their children about how to make use of the internet as a search engine. I suggest that parents should encourage their children to play sports. The reason is that the children will be determined and perseverant if they are becoming an athlete. Sports can also educate children about the importance of sportsmanship and teamwork. Instead of being addicted to the internet, they should spend time on doing voluntary work. It will be a meaningful and impressive experience. I think parents must supervise them and tell them how to manage their time effectively.

In conclusion, I hope my advice is helpful. All parents, please be more concerned with your children and stop relying on maids. Then, your children will become more independent.

First of all, humans kill wild animals for making money. For example, crocodile skins were taken for making expensive luxury handbags. People also take elephant trunks to make statues out of pleasure.

Besides, there is a loss of habitat and sources of food for wildlife after a massive hunting of animals. I cannot emphasize more that animals, like humans, should have their rights to live so we cannot hunt them. If humans kill all wildlife, they cannot live on earth any longer.

Moreover, wildlife deserves our respects for they have done so many good things for us. Therefore, we must protect it rather than destroy it. If we do not protect the animals, our children cannot see them in future. In fact, humans are capable of co-existing with them. For instance, if people stop hunting wildlife, the animals can be saved. So, I think we need to repent before it is too late.
