The preparation of the Lunar New Year Fair Stall

The Lunar New Year Fair Stall was prepared by 6A students who take the Principles of Account and Economics as their A-Level subjects. This project started in December 2007. In December, a number of students took part in a seminar held in Kowloon Tong in order to get more information about what we had to consider in the preparation, for example, how much stock we should purchase, when we needed to start the preparation and how the helpers should be arranged.

However, everything started late. Because of the first term examination, the preparation was delayed until the examination was finished. We had to open our stall in less than two weeks and we hadn't started to find the stock and we even didn't know what kind of stock we should purchase.

Fortunately, our students worked efficiently. Some of them volunteered to go to Shenzhen to purchase the stock. In order to attract different kinds of customers, a variety of goods were purchased. Not only did we have products purchased by our students, we also had some products such as toys, clothes and artificial flowers donated by parents.

A few days before our stall was opened, some of the students stayed at school to help with the classification of the stock and to decide the selling price of each product.

For me, it was a meaningful experience because some of the concepts that we had learned in the Accounting lessons and Economics lessons were applied in the real world. This was the first time we have experienced how to start a business and it can be of real benefit for us in the future.



Starting Our Business

After our hurried but earnest preparation of the Lunar New Year Fair Stall, we finally started our business in the afternoon of 3rd February 2008. We were all happy that we could start our business on time. However, we were a little bit worried that our sales would be quite low, especially as the main aim was to raise money for Silver Power.

On the first two days, our sales amount was not so good. We only sold a few products on each day. Nevertheless, we were not dejected. On the contrary, we seemed to get a lot of power. We promoted our products with sincerity. At the beginning, we had no volunteers to help us except during normal school time. The committee members of this Lunar New Year Fair Stall were the shopkeepers. We went to our stall when we left school. I remember that we operated our business for 4 days, but all of these days were rainy and very cold. Fortunately, the owner of our school bus company, Uncle Yan, bought some hot and delicious desserts for us. It was an unforgettable experience.

On the third day, the number of people who went to the Lunar New Year Fair Stall had risen and so our sales amount had increased too. The money in the fund raising box was increasing. We were happy about it.

I think the most exciting moment was the last day, which was on 6th February, 2008. Many volunteers helped us that day. The rainy day did not stop people from going to the Lunar New Year Fair Stall. In the final few hours, we kept promoting our remaining stocks and the stocks on the table disappeared one by one. In the last hour, we reduced our price from \$10 to \$5 for each product, and then from \$5 to \$2 for each product. One of our customers couldn't believe it and a lady bought a pair of shoes and two toys. It only cost \$6 but she gave me \$20, and she said she would feel embarrassed to pay so little. It was an interesting experience. At the end, we raised about seven thousand dollars. This was great news for us, and it showed that our efforts were not in vain.

The History of Easter

Easter is one of the most important religious festivals among Christians. In modern times, it celebrates the resurrection of Jesus Christ, which Christians believe occurred on the third day after his crucifixion. Many non-religious cultural elements have become part of this holiday, and those aspects are often celebrated by many Christians and non-Christians.

Easter is a movable feast because it is not fixed every year. Easter falls at some point between late March and late April each year, following the cycle of the moon. The date of Easter this year starts from 21st March (Good Friday) to 24th March (Easter Monday).

Similar to other Christian dates, the celebration of Easter extends beyond the church. In the past, it had been a time of celebration and feasting. Nowadays, it is commercially important, seeing wide sales of greeting cards and confectionery such as chocolate Easter eggs, marshmallow bunnies, and jellybeans.



Easter Eggs

Easter eggs are specially decorated eggs given to celebrate the Easter holiday. The oldest tradition is to use dyed and painted chicken eggs, but a modern custom is to substitute chocolate eggs, or plastic eggs filled with confectionery such as jellybeans. These eggs are often hidden, supposedly in an Easter Bunny, for children to find on Easter morning.

Recipe of the chocolate Easter eggs

Initially, Easter was a festival that had no relation with Christianity. It was actually the name of the Goddess of Spring and the festival was a symbol of hope. However, after the death of Jesus Christ and His resurrection, Easter became a festival to commemorate these events.

Nowadays, when we talk about Easter, people will probably think about Easter rabbits and Easter eggs. Easter rabbits symbolize an abundant harvest. And Easter eggs symbolize revival.

Okay, let's make an easy and special food for Easter – chocolate Easter eggs.

Before we start to make the chocolate egg, there are several items and ingredients that we need to prepare.

Here is the list:

Mould for chocolate egg	price around \$14~\$38 each
Toothpick	x3
Water bath	40°C ~60°C
Dark chocolate	1 bar
White chocolate	1 bar

Let's start.

1. Cut the chocolate bar into small pieces and melt it in the water bath at a temperature 40°C ~ 60°C.
2. Fill the pattern of the chocolate mould with white chocolate.
After the white chocolate has solidified, fill the other part of the mould with dark chocolate.
3. When the surface of the chocolate has solidified, put the mould in a refrigerator for at least 20 minutes.
4. Now, you can take the chocolate out. As it is only half of the egg, we need to combine two of them to form a whole chocolate egg.
5. Prepare a (metal) plate warmed with the water so that the temperature of the plate can melt the chocolate.
6. Put the flat part of the chocolate egg on the plate, and, when the chocolate starts to melt, take it out and stick it on the other half of the egg.

Tips:

- If you want to have coffee flavor, you can add instant coffee powder to the melted white chocolate.
- If you want the chocolate to instantly melt in your mouth, you should first melt the chocolate at 60°C, and then melt it again at about human body temperature
- If the temperature is too high, the taste of the chocolate will not be as delicious.
